Extraordinary Board vacancy

In January, we received Board member Memory Edmonds' resignation. We'd like to acknowledge Memory's contribution to the Board – we really appreciate the skills and experience she brought to the table. Kāore e ārikarika ngā mihi ki a koe i whakapau kaha mō tō tātou hapori Memory!

As a result, we now have an extraordinary vacancy to fill. A by-election is not required as it is within 12 months of the Local Body Elections, which are scheduled for October this year. Construction begins on Te Whāiti retaining wall

Construction of a retaining wall has commenced on Te Whāiti Road around the fifteen-kilometre mark. Contractor, Tracks Concrete, began the work on February 17, following a karakia.

The project, which includes installation and reinstatement of riprap and gabion baskets, is expected to take three weeks to complete.

During this time, one lane of Te Whāiti Road will be closed with stop/go in place during daylight hours, and traffic lights operating in the evening to allow for continued traffic flow in both directions.

Motorists and other road users are advised to exercise extra caution when traveling through this area and to expect minor delays.
