

Long Term Plan adopted

The Whakatāne District Long Term Plan 2024-34 and supporting documents are now adopted, and the rates are set. The Long Term Plan process took longer than usual due to the coalition government's U-turn decision that local councils needed to include Three Waters costs in their budgets.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to give feedback so the Mayor and Councillors could make decisions on your behalf. Councils are currently facing the biggest inflationary increases in a generation, and your Mayor and Councillors have had to grapple with balancing current needs and planning for the future.

Due to the delays, the first rates bill will be due later than normal too, on Friday 20 September. If you're a ratepayer, you can expect to receive your bill (in the post or via email, depending on what you've chosen) in the first week of September. However, the second bill will still be due in November like it normally is.

There are lots of parts that make up the Long Term Plan, including decisions around the four key questions that were in the consultation phase. The Mayor and Councillors also decided to introduce fees at the Murupara Resource Recovery Centre (formerly the Refuse Transfer Station) from 1 February 2025 for a 12-month trial period.
